Board Training--Library Advocacy: Video of Sally Gardner Reed speaking on Advocacy. Important for trustees to be advocates--to be visible and vocal, show that they care. What are the best ways to be trustees for their libraries?

- 1. Know the mayor, council people in their community, and other people have a lot of influence. You want that influence to be positive towards the library. Have to talk to them and tell them why it matters; don't just give information but actually explain why it is important for our community.
- 2. Trustees should be part of budget time; Need to know the budget scheduling. When are the first budget talks taking place? Explain how critically important it is for library to be well-funded.
- 3. Libraries are critical in the digital age. Libraries collect the world of information and making it freely available to all people . . . world of information isn't free, and libraries are bearing that cost and redistributing and making it available. We have to show the return on that investment. What is the cost of failure of libraries to help unemployed, children going into Kindergarten, etc. That is the case we have to make. Pay for prevention rather than pay for failure.
- 4. Credibility of trustees damaged when we see libraries wither on the vine because we are unwilling to fight for it. Trustees build credibility when they fight for something as important as their public library. More engagement at the local library, more likely that there will be success.
- 5. Strategies for trustees and friends for convincing funders and others that libraries are necessary: postcards, phone calls, digital platforms.

Daniel: word of mouth is still the most powerful way to disseminate information about the library.
